



SO, YOU WANT TO BE A REF?

REFEREE FAQ's

(frequently asked questions)



Q. Who can be a ref?

A. Anyone who is interested and is age 13 or older (or will be turning 13 withing the current lacrosse year)

Q. Why become a ref?

A. You love the game of lacrosse and you can earn money while participating. It is also a fun thing to do and you will be giving back to the game. Oh yeah, you may even find it helps you become a better player!

Q. What do I have to do?

A. It's easy! Sign up when you register for lacrosse. You will need to take a referee clinic but the Association will take care of this for you. You also have to be available during the season to committ to refereeing lacrosse and/or working the shot clock. The Association will pay for the clinic so long as you referee a minimum of three games during the season.

Q. When are the clinics?

A. In the Spring before the season starts. They are sometimes held in Langley but if not, they will hosted by another Association locally. They are on a Saturday and last the whole day. All referees (new & old) must take a clinic each year.

Q. Let's talk money. How much can I make?

A. That depends on what level you ref but beginner refs will make \$10 per game refereeing Mini-Tyke and Tyke games as well as \$10 per game if they do the shot clock at other levels.

Q. What equipment do I need?

A. Jersey (cost \$25), Whistle, Black Pants, Black shoes, Rule Book (supplied when you take the clinic)
